## Eastern Ontario Hamfest 2025 – Volunteers Required



### **JOTA: Jamboree on the Air**

The Jamboree On The Air is an annual event in which Scouts and Guides all over the world connect with each other by means of Amateur Radio. Short-wave radio signals carry their voices to virtually any corner of the world.

The JOTA 2024 started at 00:00 h local time this past Saturday, October 19 and ran until 23:59 h local time this past Sunday, October 20.

I was able to get involved this year as I was approached by Dawn Marie Devenny (at the club's recent ham fest) who had been following my YouTube channel and Facebook and saw me working with my own grandkids and asked me if I would be interested in joining her scouts for this year's event and of course I said yes immediately.

We had 3 scouts present – Scouters Bruce, Cian, Ken and Dawn along with Scouts Pascal, Matt and Ethan.

I arrived an hour early just to ensure that I had the HF rig ready to go, the DMR Talk Group added, thanks to Rene C. as well as I had 2 HT s with me for any repeater traffic.

Everyone showed up on time and as soon as the scouts started circling the table with all of the radios and started hearing some DX stations as POTA (Parks on the Air) was in full swing at the same time, their eyes lit up and they were ready to participate.

The Scouts came prepared with the phonetic alphabet in had, a list of 10 questions to other scouts such as, what is your favorite badge, what color is your units handkerchief, how old are you, what is your QTH and others.

So just before the event began, I took all of the scouts and scouters for a tour of the equipment, I had my vertical set up on 20 Meters, my Yaesu 991-a on HF, my Anytone D578UVPlus set up on the DMR JOTA talk group and my Yaesu HT and Baofeng HT for repeater JOTA activity.

I showed the scouts what frequencies were where allowed to operate on and we started scanning the bands about 15 min before the show was to start. Then I called out Jamboree on the air just to get a radio check to see if all of the equipment was working correctly and when the other operator came back with the VA3EWV call sign, the scouts faces lit up and they were ready to go.

It was a very successful outing with the scouts of the Cornwall 3rd Group and we have been

invited to participate with them again next year.
